

Background

V ision 2030 Jamaica – National Development Plan is the country's first long-term strategic national development plan designed to enable Jamaica to achieve developed country status by 2030.

It provides a comprehensive framework in which the economic, social, environmental and governance dimensions of national development are integrated. The Plan, which was approved in Parliament in 2009 provides a Strategic Road Map for the achievement of 4 synergistic and integrated national goals and 15 related national outcomes, which when achieved will culminate in the realization of the national vision, encapsulated in the national vision statement: "Jamaica, the place of choice to live, work, raise families and do business". This vision statement embodies a clear message that emerged from the inclusive plan development process and encapsulates the yearning of our people for a secure and prosperous future. Under Vison 2030 Jamaica, national development is designed to be sustainable and inclusive, engaging all Jamaicans in the plan design and implementation processes and providing equitable opportunities to all Jamaicans to participate in the process and benefit from the intended outcomes.

Vision 2030 Jamaica is built on a results-based management (RBM) framework, comprising the national development results (4 National Goals, 15 National Outcomes), a strategic and operational framework geared towards the achievement of the goals and outcomes, and evidence-based practice, underpinned by a monitoring and evaluation (M&E) framework for measuring development performance and informing medium term prioritization. The successive 3-year Medium Term Socio-Economic Policy Framework (MTF) – the main mechanism for plan implementation - is aligned to the overall vision, goals and national outcomes of Vision 2030 Jamaica and allows for a stage by stage operationalization of the long term National Development Plan. It is an implementation framework underpinned by an extensive strategic planning and prioritization process to guide stakeholders to achieve the goals and outcomes of the long-term development plan. Each MTF therefore serves as a companion document to the Vision 2030 Jamaica – National Development Plan, comprising the medium term priority strategies and actions that will be pursued in the implementation of the Plan. MTF 2018 – 2021 is the 4th medium term strategic programme to advance the implementation of the Vision 2030 Jamaica – National Development Plan and is based on the nation's development aspirations and guiding principles as articulated in the country's long-term development plan.

Vision 2030 Jamaica serves as the axis around which efforts to achieve the Agenda 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) will be organized – *A Road Map for SDG Implementation in Jamaica, approved by Cabinet in 2017*. Accordingly, the MTF is also the main mechanism for "implementation" of the SDGs in Jamaica, and MTF 2018-2021 shows the alignment between the national outcomes of Vision 2030 Jamaica and the SDGs as well as the alignment between national and sector strategies and SDG targets. The Road Map states a 91 per cent alignment between Jamaica's national development agenda¹ and the SDGs (based on a 2016 Rapid Impact Assessment); and presents a broad framework for strengthening the Plan Implementation process, including policy bundles and accelerators. The content of the Road Map gives focus to: an action framework; financing; data monitoring and reporting; coordination – institutional mechanisms; and advocacy in support of Plan Implementation. The Road Map will inform each successive MTF to support the strengthening of medium-term prioritization and alignment with the SDGs.

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) were adopted by the 193 Member States of the United Nations in September 2015 and came into force on January 1, 2016. The SDGs represents a landmark agreement to advance "People, Planet, Prosperity, Peace and Partnership (5Ps)" – the creation of a better world that is free of poverty, underpinned by universal peace, and where 'no one is left behind'




Strategic Alignment – Vision 2030 Jamaica and the SDGs



Goal 4, "Jamaica has a healthy natural environment" recognizes the importance of the natural environment and harmony among development activities, environmental sustainability and conservation of the country's natural resources.
